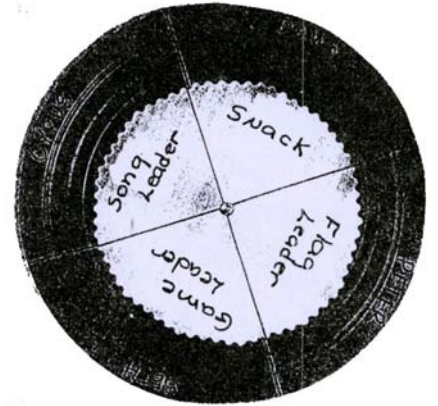


# The Job Wheel

If kapers (chores) generate “whine” among your club members, consider a Job Wheel. With a spin of its dial, it alleviates the tedium of one member always doing the same chore and ensures that everyone participates.

To make a wheel, you’ll need 2 paper plates. Use scissors (or pinking shears for a fancier look) to trim 1 ½ inches from the outer rim of one. Center the trimmed plate on top of the other and attach the two in the center with a brass paper fastener. Use a ruler and a permanent marker (or paint pen) to divide the wheel into equal sections, 1 for each member.

Fill in names on the outer plate and specific kapers (snack, clean-up, game leader, song leader, flag leader, etc.) on the inner plate. Tack the plate to a bulletin board or attach strips of adhesive-backed magnetic tape and attach to something metal. Rotate the wheel once each meeting



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
